Guy Noble has had a long association with Queensland Symphony Orchestra, having

first worked with the Orchestra in 1994. He has been host of the Music on Sundays series since 2005 and conducted the Orchestra in many other concerts in QPAC, Cairns, Townsville and the Gold Coast. When he isn't with Queensland Symphony Orchestra, Guy Noble also performs with the other major orchestras around the country. He also has worked with the Malaysian Philharmonic, the Hong Kong Philharmonic (in Music of John Williams) and the Auckland Philharmonic in their Unwrap the Classics series, and the Bergen Philharmonic as part of the Bergen Festival. He is also host and conductor of the Adelaide Symphony Orchestra's Classics Unwrapped series at the Adelaide Town Hall.

Guy Noble is the host and accompanist each year for Great Opera Hits (Opera Australia) in the Joan Sutherland Theatre of the Sydney Opera House. His Opera! The Opera will be performed as part of the inaugural season of Coast Opera Australia in December.

Guy Noble has worked with a wide variety of international performers with orchestras across Australia, including Harry Connick Jnr, Ben Folds, The Beach Boys, The Pointer Sisters, Dianne Reeves, Glenn Frey, Randy Newman, Clive James, Conchita, The Two Cellos, Alfie Boe, and Olivia Newton John

He is also the host of Concert Hall on Qantas Radio.



## *Soloist* Karin Schaupp,

is one of the most outstanding guitarists on the international scene, her playing hailed by

the German press as "so perfect, so complete, that it seems like a miracle". In her teens she won prestigious international prizes in Italy and Spain, and is today sought after internationally as a recitalist, soloist and festival guest, making countless television and radio appearances.

Karin has released six best-selling solo CDs for Warner Music and ABC Classics as well as various award-winning ensemble and orchestral albums. Recent releases include *Wayfaring* (2018) with cellist Umberto Clerici, the ARIA-award winning Songs of the Latin Skies (2017) with Australian songstress Katie Noonan; *Mosaic* (2015) the first ever CD dedicated to guitar concertos by Australian composers; the ARIA nominated *Fandango* (2011) with Flinders Quartet; and *Cradle Songs* (2010), a collection of lullabies from around the world, all arranged for solo guitar.

Performance highlights include performing as soloist with the London Philharmonic Orchestra, some 150 performances of Lotte's Gift, performances at a Commonwealth Games Closing Ceremony, Goodwill Games Opening Ceremony, World Expo (Japan) and Hong Kong Arts Festival, and a Musica Viva International Concert Season tour with Pavel Steidl.

Karin is Head of Classical Guitar at the Queensland Conservatorium, Griffith University. She lives in Brisbane with her husband Giac and two young children.

The event saw competitors shoot in Production, Standard and Open Divisions. Club member, Shaun Hannant said the International Practice Shooting Confederation (ISPC) group has been running for just three years, growing from 5 members to 35 members this year.

Practical shooting is an International competition that is shot on all continents, with local, state, national, regional and international championships happening regularly.

The sport of Practical target shooting sees a variety of target types; paper, steel, stationary and moving, scoring targets and penalty targets. Shooters compete in several stages, with each stage using a different number and arrangement of targets to create a shooting challenge that competitors need to solve as quickly and accurately as possible. All participants, both male, female and juniors, compete together over the same stages, with the same rules and the same scoring procedures.

Local club members achieved excellent results across the Production, Open and Standard Divisions. Shaun Hannant finished in second place in the A grade



production division and regraded to master grade. Michael Beak finished third in the B grade production division and regraded to A grade.

# Delivering for Flynn

FEDERAL MEMBER FOR FLYNN, KEN O'DOWD MP RETURNED TO CANBERRA EARLIER THIS MONTH FOR THE OFFICIAL SWEARING IN OF THE 46TH PARLIAMENT OF AUSTRALIA. MR O'DOWD TOOK TO SOCIAL MEDIA TO THANK THE VOTERS OF FLYNN FOR ENTRUSTING HIM TO REPRESENT THEM FOR ANOTHER TERM.

Mr O'Dowd said that in the House of Representatives, the first item on the Government's agenda was to deliver a fundamental election promise, tax relief for hardworking Australians. "Our tax relief plan, once fully implemented, will see 94% of taxpayers face a personal marginal tax rate of no more than 30%. The Morrison Government will deliver immediate tax relief more than 10 million Australians of up to \$1080 when they lodge their tax returns this year."

Mr O'Dowd explained that the Government is focused on their plan for tax relief which also includes tax cuts for small, medium and family businesses. The new legislation means that 2021-22, the small business tax rate will be just 25 per cent. "The extension and expansion of the instant asset write-off will provide the incentive for small businesses to invest in the equipment they need to grow," Mr O'Dowd said.

Following the official proceedings on July 1st Mr O'Dowd said the Senate

was addressed by Australia's new Governor General, David Hurley. Mr Hurley spoke of the future of Australia and what Australians expect from the government, and the parliament they elected in May. "They voted for a government that understands Australians are focused on raising their families, running their businesses, working hard, volunteering, and caring for their family and friends," the Governor General said in his speech.

Mr O'Dowd echoed the Governor Generals sentiment saying that the Morrison Government was elected on a platform to keep the economy strong and on its commitment to pursue policies that enable Australians to retain their hard-earned income and allow them the freedom and opportunity to make their own choices about their priorities in life. Mr O'Dowd told Gladstone News that the Government's agenda will be driven by the Australian people.

Several key policies that will support this vision will be introduced to the parliament over the coming term including changes to industrial relations laws, setting up a National Skills Commission and the establishment of Industry Training Hubs and new government initiatives to help Australians return to the workforce.

"In a plan to make it easier for more Australians to buy their first home, the Government will introduce the First Home Loan Deposit Scheme," Mr O'Dowd said. "From 1 January 2020, first home buyers who have already saved at least five per cent of their deposit, and who earn up to \$125,000 for a single person or \$200,000 for

couples, will be able to get earlier access to better mortgage finance," Mr O'Dowd explained.

Supporting major infrastructure projects is also high on the Government's list of priorities with planned commitments to Regional Australia, Indigenous Australians, Health, Mental Health, Older Australians, Education, Government Services, Security, Foreign Policy, Energy, Climate Change, Education and online crime and safety also planned for reform.

Parliament will resume on July 22nd with both the House of Representatives and the Senate in session for 8 days.

"Jade is returning home following 15 weeks of intensive training at Aviation Rescue Fire Fighting Services (ARFFS) state-of-the-art fire training ground in Melbourne," Mr Jenkins said.

In training, Jade has completed theoretical and practical training including fighting simulated aircraft and structural fires, aviation rescue techniques and dealing with the hazards of highly flammable aviation fuels.

"This training has helped prepare her to begin working at the station, but there is still much to learn," Mr Jenkins explained. "As Jade joins our crews and learns about our airport, she will continue to gain the valuable experience and training that make our firefighters ready to respond to any incident on or around the airport within a matter of minutes."

umans are responsible for 100% of ■ marine debris, and locally, we are about to get a better insight into the waste habits of the Curtis Coast, thanks to a Local Action Community Reef Protection grant. The grant has helped to fund the installation of nine Drain Buddies at key locations throughout Gladstone recently.

Fitzroy Basin Association Inc. (FBA) is working in partnership with Cleanwater Group who have installed the systems, the Local Marine Advisory Committee (LMAC), local Reef Guardian councils and the community to oversee the project.

Holly Lambert, FBA's Community Partnerships Coordinator, says this project demonstrates an upstream solution to a downstream problem. "This project signals the beginning of a better understanding of human behaviour when it comes to waste in our local communities. From this point forward, we can verify the biggest types of litter and

begin targeting ways to reduce their presence," Ms Lambert explained.

The Drain Buddy is a cost-effective innovative and simple solution according to Development Manager Aaron Horsley. He said the system while simple in design has the potential to change the way the Gladstone community examines its litter.

The Drain Buddy system consist of heavy-duty basket that only allows water to pass through, collecting all other matter including litter, organic debris and sediment. Matter that is collected will be emptied quarterly, then sorted, analysed and recorded in the Australian Marine Debris Initiative database. The data collected will provide insight into what the community is throwing away, where it comes from and will lay strong foundations for the subsequent success of local source reduction campaigns in the



future.

Karl French, Gladstone Local Marine Advisory Committee Chair, said the project holds the potential to change management of marine debris in our waterways. "Marine debris is one of the five key threats to the health of the Reef, so it's critical to continue building community mindfulness around waste and consumption habits."

The project is funded by the partnership between the Australian Government's Reef Trust and the Great Barrier Reef Foundation and is being delivered by the Fitzroy Basin Association (FBA) with support from the Capricorn Coast and Gladstone Local Marine Advisory Committees.

The Automated External Defibrillators (AED) were recently installed in multiple Gladstone region Woolworths stores and are part of a priority roll out for regional areas program at Woolworths. The AED is designed to be used by anyone, with clear step-by-step voice instructions that can guide members of the public through the process.

"The best medical advice tells us that access to an AED early on can greatly increase the chance of survival."

The defibrillators installed in the Gladstone region Woolworths stores are supplied by Winc, in partnership with Integrity Health & Safety, Australia's first indigenous provider of work health and safety products, which will also enable a positive social impact.

Integrity Health & Safety CEO and intensive care paramedic, Liam Harte said by engaging with Integrity Health & Safety, Woolworths was enabling the company to fund Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander nurses and midwives for CPR, Flu Vaccination and Leadership courses aiming to build Indigenous healthcare capability -particularly in rural and remote Australia.

#### **DELICIOUS CASHEW KORMA CURRY**

#### **INGREDIENTS**

- · 1 Tbsp coconut oil
- 2 medium sweet potatoes, 2cm cubes
- · 2 medium carrots, sliced
- 1/2 head cauliflower, chopped into florets
- · medium onion, diced
- 1 c. green beans, cut into 4cm pieces
- 2 cans of coconut milk, well shaken
- · 1 can tomato paste
- 1/2 c. cashews, soaked in boiling water 1-2 hours
- 1 Tbsp lemon juice
- · 4 cloves garlic, minced
- · 2 Tbsp garam masala
- · 1 Tbsp curry powder
- · 2 tsp cumin
- $\cdot$  11/2 tsp coriander
- · 1 tsp salt
- 1 tsp turmeric
- $\cdot$  1/2 tsp chili powder
- 1 cup frozen peas
- 1/2 cup of coriander minced
- For serving prepare brown rice, cauliflower rice, or quinoa

#### **METHOD**

- 1. Heat the olive oil in a large skillet over medium-high heat; add the sweet potatoes, carrots, cauliflower florets, and onion. Cooking, stirring occasionally, until vegetables are just a little tender, about 4-5 minutes. Stir in the cut green beans.
- 2. Make the Korma sauce Using a food processor, add
  the coconut milk, tomato
  paste, soaked cashews,
  lemon juice, garlic, and all
  spices. Blend until smooth
  and creamy. Remember,
  scrape down the sides as
  needed to incorporate all
  the flavours into the
  Korma sauce.
- 3. Pour the Korma sauce over the vegetables in the skillet. Carefully, stir thoroughly mix the sauce through the vegetables until the sauce starts to simmer. Reduce the heat to medium-low and cover. Simmer the vegetables 15-20 minutes until all are tender and cooked through. Finally, stir in the frozen peas and chopped coriander.
- Serve with your choice of rice, quinoa or for added vegetables some cauliflower rice.



#### Cowan Family

Walter and Robert
Cowan came to the
Gladstone area around 1859
and Walter went into the
hotel trade while Robert, his
younger brother, was more
interested in life on the land.

Walter married Sarah Jardine and they had six children: Thomas Jardine, Grace Jardine (1862) (Powe), Janet (1863) (Powe), Leslie (1867 who died at birth), Walter James (1870) and Sarah Ann (1874) (Evans). Around 1868 Walter was an overseer on Mt Larcom Station.

In 1875, Walter applied for the license of the Commercial Hotel in Gladstone. It appears that Walter held on to this license until his death in 1891.

A new hotel had been built at the corner of Yarroon Street and China Lane (now Central Lane) and was given the name Blue Bell Hotel. A license for the sale of liquor at this hotel was granted in 1875 to Sarah Cowan. This indicates that Walter Cowan was licensee of the Commercial Hotel and that Sarah conducted the running of the Blue Bell Hotel at the same time.

Sarah held onto this hotel until 1892. Walter (Jnr), at 21 years of age, had the license when Sarah died in 1896. In 1898 he added another story to the newer part of his hotel, turning the bottom floor into a coffee lounge with bedrooms above. At the same time as he did these renovations, he had a hall built across the road, naming it the Theatre Royal, which later became the Trocadero Hall.

Walter continued with this license until early 1905 when tragedy struck, the Blue Bell Hotel was burned to the ground. After the fire, Walter made application for permission to carry on the license of the Blue Bell Hotel on a temporary basis and opened for trading in a building owned by Herbert Stephen Owbridge, a relative of Walter's. Walter made a series of applications for different temporary premises until finally in February 1906 the hotel was rebuilt. This hotel later became the Ocean View Hotel and is still trading but has had several more names.

DON'T TELL MUM I WORK ON THE **RIGS... SHE THINKS** I'M A PIANO PLAYER IN A WHOREHOUSE **BY PAUL CARTER** 

Tlistened to this audio book  $oldsymbol{\perp}$  while driving to work. The opening chapter had me laughing, while slightly horrified at what had happened to this poor man when working on an oil rig overseas.

This book is about Paul Carter's working life on oil rigs all around the world, while trying to balance a personal life. It chronicles his childhood, his time as a green-horn in the oil industry, and his progression into running his own crew

He regales us with his funny and sometimes hair-raising stories of life on the rigs and his down time in remote places around the world. Many oil rigs are in remote parts of the world and often in countries where it is dangerous for foreign people to work; you have a target on your back for kidnapping and being held for ransom. He



has met some characters that he regards as lifelong friends and some that he would rather never see, let alone work with, again. In this book he tries to break into another career away from the rigs, but the money keeps pulling him back in.

I laughed and cringed throughout this book and can recommend it to anyone who normally doesn't read non-fiction: it's a good introduction to the genre.


