## STUDENTS CRACK CODE FOR **ROBOT BATTLES**

**CENTRAL QUEENSLAND STUDENTS HAVE PUT THEIR DESIGN AND CODING SKILLS TO THE TEST, AS CQUNIVERSITY GLADSTONE HOSTED THE ANNUAL** FIRST LEGO LEAGUE (FLL) TOURNAMENT.

The energetic and exciting science, technology, engineering and maths (STEM) challenge is part of a global competition for primary and secondary students, with 11 schools represented in Central Queensland.

Organiser and Gladstone West State School deputy principal Sarah Jacob said 140 students were excited to show off their skills at the Gladstone event on October 31.

"Our FLL event is always a highlight in the STEM calendar for our region's primary and secondary schools, this year more than ever," she said.

"Adhering to our COVID-safe plans, we were able to bring kids together from as far away as Emerald, to compete, challenge themselves and have fun at our Gladstone Regional Tournament."

The event challenged teams to solve scientific challenges, and code Lego robots to complete missions around a game table.

The Champion's Award was won by Chanel College's Chanel Crocs, who will proceed to the State Competition in Brisbane in December, along with Gladstone State High School's Rekin

Sharks and Calliope State School's RoboTRACKS.

Sarah thanked volunteers for making the big event happen. She also acknowledged the support of sponsors CQUniversity, Shell's QGC business and Gladstone West State School.

"We wish our local teams all the best for the State Competition, and we hope 2021 will be bigger and better than ever for our First Lego League!" she said.

## spiced gingerbread cookie bars

You can top them with a basic white icing, or with a delicious cream cheese frosting or don't top them at all. I promise they are delicious any way you serve them.




#### **Ingredients**

- 1/2 cup butter melted
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1 1/2 cups brown sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla
- 1/3 cup molasses
- 1 egg
- 2 teaspoons baking soda
- 2 cups flour
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon ground ginger
- 1/4 teaspoon allspice
- 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg
- 1/2 teaspoon salt




- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees.
- 2. Spray a 9"×13" baking pan with nonstick cooking spray and set aside.
- 3. In a large bowl, combine butter, sugar, brown sugar, vanilla, and molasses and beat until creamy, about 1-2 minutes. \*The batter does get thick, so a stand mixer works best if you have one.
- 4. Add the egg and stir until incorporated.
- 5. Add the dry ingredients and mix until dough is well combined. It will be thick, like cookie dough.
- 6. Spread the dough with a silicone spatula (or your fingers) evenly into the prepared baking pan.
- 7. Bake for 15-20 minutes and let cool.
- 8. Cool completely before frosting (optional) and cutting into squares.



## NAIDOC WEEK CELEBRATIONS

NAIDOC WEEK
CELEBRATIONS WERE
HELD FROM SUNDAY 8
NOVEMBER TO SUNDAY 15
NOVEMBER TO CELEBRATE
THE HISTORY, CULTURE,
AND ACHIEVEMENTS OF
ABORIGINAL AND TORRES
STRAIT ISLANDER PEOPLES.

NAIDOC is celebrated not only in Indigenous communities, but by Australians from all walks of life. The week provided a great opportunity to participate in a range of activities and to show support to your local Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander community. NAIDOC Week is usually held in July each year, however, due to COVID-19, the National NAIDOC Committee postponed the festivities in the interest of safety for all communities.

On Thursday November 12, Gladstone's NAIDOC Committee hosted a Family

Day and Expo at Barney Point Park, which featured an array of food, music, and traditional dancing.

Yaleela Torrens a Counsellor and Play Therapist at the Gladstone's Women's Health Centre said,

"NAIDOC Week is a celebration of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander culture, it is incredibly important this year due to the theme 'Always Was, Always Will be' which recognizes and pays respect to the oldest living culture in the world."

"The theme to me, means that we are recognized, and we are embraced for continuing to survive in this country. We are still here, we are a very resilient people and we know that this was and always will be Aboriginal land."

The Gladstone Regional Art Gallery & Museum (GRAGM) will recognize the

week by highlighting a First Nation's cultural collection of items including drawings, prints, paintings, 3D digital works and engaging stories.

This exhibition, to be held in the gallery's Museum Room, will be open during NAIDOC Week and then for an extended period over the festive season.




