- · 5 large egg
- 130 ml cream
- · 1 tbsp onion grated
- 2.6 sheets puff pastry
- · 1 cup cheese grated
- 1/2 cup ham (deli) chopped

Method

- 1. Preheat oven to 210C.
- 2. Grease muffin pan.
- 3. Using a fork, beat eggs, cream, onion, and salt and pepper in a bowl until well-combined.
- 4. Cut and line each muffin hole with pastry.
- 5. Divide ham and cheese into muffin holes, and spoon in egg mixture.
- 6. Bake for 20-22 minutes

The team at Gladstone News would also like to thank everyone who was involved in Shop To Win 2020.



CSIRO joins GPC in eco monitoring

AUSTRALIA'S TOP SCIENCE BODY, CSIRO, HAS JOINED FORCES WITH GLADSTONE PORTS CORPORATION (GPC) TO BETTER **UNDERSTAND THE ENVIRONMENT AND IMPROVE SAFETY SYSTEMS, WITH A NEW** WATER QUALITY AND WIND MONITORING STATION INSTALLED AT THE PORT OF **BUNDABERG.**

The equipment is located on top of a pylon in the mouth of the river and is expected to collect a more in-depth reading of the water and deliver comprehensive data.

The data collected will offer GPC and CSIRO scientists a better understanding of the environment surrounding the Port of Bundaberg.

It's an upgrade from what CSIRO was previously using at the Sir Thomas Hiley Wharf to measure water quality and wind.

CSIRO Research Scientist Geoffrey Carlin said the pylon at the Port of Bundaberg is well-positioned for monitoring the effects on coastal waters and the effects on reefs.

"The installation of water quality monitoring instrumentation is a collaborative effort that provides key data to CSIRO, GPC, Maritime Safety Queensland, and Queensland Sugar Limited to improve our management of Australia's marine areas," Mr Carlin said.

As well as keeping an eye on the environment, the monitoring technology will be able to send real-time updates to assist our marine pilots further in their navigating ships safely in and out of the Port.

GPC Acting CEO Craig Walker said the technology is a win for the environment and for safety systems at GPC.

"Our employees and their expertise is our greatest asset and they are continuously working to improve every facet of our operations," Mr Walker

said.

"Environmental sustainability underpins everything we do and this technology upgrade will enable us to closely monitor the environment we operate in."

Raw data will also be accessible in real-time on the CSIRO website.

the life of elvie brown

ELVIE, THE ELDEST CHILD OF DAVID AND ANNIE **ALDOUS, WAS BORN IN ROCKHAMPTON IN 1920.**

Both her parents were from Calliope and they married when David returned from WW1. Elvie is the fourth generation of her family to live in Calliope and she had four younger brothers. As a child she listened to music on the gramophone and radio. She remembers living a happy childhood, passing the time, and visiting friends by walking to their houses, where they would make cubby houses. An Aunt taught Elvie to play the piano and she kept playing into her later years.

Elvie attended the only school in Calliope (at that time) and there were fourteen students in her class. Some of the students rode horses to school but most had to walk, including Elvie who had to travel one mile. Basketball was popular with female students and Elvie often travelled to Gladstone and remembers winning against the Gladstone State School. Her team never had much luck against the Parsons Point School because they were much too good. Elvie had a passion for tennis, so much so that in later years she travelled to Melbourne to see the Australian Open.

Every Saturday she attended dances

wearing beautiful gowns made by her Grandmother and Aunts who were dressmakers. They taught her to sew, a skill she passed on to her own family.


She left school at fourteen, which was common for girls in that era. Elvie worked at the Grand Hotel for a few months before starting her nursing career. At twenty-one she was employed at the Gladstone Hospital as a domestic and then applied and was accepted for a nursing position in Rockhampton. The Matron convinced her to stay in Gladstone and she nursed soldiers suffering malaria during WW2.

She did not nurse for long before she married Cyril (Sardy) Brown in 1944 in Calliope. He was a jockey like his two brothers and travelled around the state, competing and often winning races. Elvie still has some of these trophies and medals. Cyril and Elvie had five children, Noela, Rhonda, Gay, Beth and Diane. Unfortunately, Noela died at five years of age in 1950. During this time, as a favour to a family member who went on holidays, Cyril and Elvie offered to look after their dairy farm.

Unfortunately, the owner died just before they were to leave on holidays, so Cyril and Elvie took over. They worked and maintained the farm for the next forty

Elvie's mode of transport was walking so at the age of forty-five she learnt how to drive a car.

Cyril passed away in 1998 after a long illness. In 2007 she moved to a new house in Calliope and she passes her time there with her favourite hobbies of cooking and gardening, as well as catching up with old friends. She gave back to the community by helping at the local church and raising money for them. Elvie still lives in New Auckland Place.





PASSIONATE CITIZEN SCIENTISTS HAVE JOINED RESEARCHERS FROM CQUNIVERSITY AUSTRALIA'S COASTAL MARINE ECOSYSTEMS RESEARCH CENTRE (CMERC) TO COLLECT SEAGRASS FLOWERS IN GLADSTONE HARBOUR, FOR THE FINAL HARVEST OF THE SEASON.

Led by CMERC Director Associate Professor Emma Jackson. the group sailed from Gladstone to Pelican Banks on Curtis Island for the research-vital work on Saturday 12 December

The harvest supports research at CQUniversity's \$6.6 million CMERC facility, where A/Prof Jackson and her team have been germinating seeds from the flowers, to replant and regenerate seagrass meadows.

Through citizen scientist initiatives, the researchers have been recruiting volunteers from the community to help harvest seagrass flowers to collect seeds - with careful precautions to avoid resident crocodiles, and manage heat and mud challenges.

"We do that in a way that doesn't impact the seagrass meadows, and it's a great way to get people involved," A/Prof Jackson said.

Local volunteers on Saturday included Josephine Sidhu, Penny Buckwell, Jason Gavin and Morgan Parker, and research assistant Elizabeth Andrews said it was a productive session.

"The flower collection went well and was successful, despite it being a bit windy and coming to the end of the flowering season," she said.

Seagrass meadows are an important coastal habitat which provides food for dugong and turtles, habitat for juvenile

fish and shellfish and act like the kidneys of our Great Barrier Reef, filtering out nutrients and sediments.

Proudly supported by the Queensland Government's Queensland Citizen Science Grants, CQU's Coastal Marine Ecosystems Research Centre (CMERC) received \$29,573 for their project Sea Flowers: growing community engagement for seagrass restoration, across locations in Gladstone, Bundaberg and the Sunshine Coast.


