## **PRIME MINISTER SCOTT MORRISON** VISITS THE GLADSTONE REGION

THIS WEEK IT WAS GREAT TO BE ABLE TO SHOW OUR PRIME MINISTER SCOTT MORRISON SOME OF THE GREAT SIGHTS GLADSTONE HAS TO OFFER.

We took a trip to Northern Oil which is leading the way in oil recycling. Here the Prime Minister made an important announcement on a new Heads of Agreement with major LNG exporters.

This is another part of our plan that will help ensure more gas is offered to the domestic market, more often, and on more competitive terms.

The Agreement, signed by Prime Minister Scott Morrison and LNG exporters, Australia Pacific LNG, Queensland Curtis LNG and Gladstone LNG, is a key part of the Government's Gas-Fired Recovery measures announced on 15 September, 2020.

"This new HoA will require LNG exporters to offer gas domestically at all times, not just in the event of a shortfall in the east coast gas market," Prime Minister Scott Morrison said.

"Along with the Australian Domestic Gas Security Mechanism, the agreement is directly aimed at securing gas supplies for the Australian domestic gas market.

Member for Flynn Ken O'Dowd said the Agreement highlights the key role gas plays in our local industries.

"The gas industry drives significant



local exports and is also a big employer in the Gladstone region and the agreement will lay the foundation for future growth aiding the COVID recovery," Mr O'Dowd said.

Prime Minister Scott Morrison also helped to usher in a new era of advanced manufacturing education, training and research in Central Queensland, with a visit to CQUniversity's Gladstone Marina campus.

The Prime Minister joined Federal Member for Flynn, Ken O'Dowd and CQUniversity Vice-Chancellor and President Professor Nick Klomp to turn the sod on the University's \$13.5 million School of Advanced Manufacturing building, a Commonwealth Government-funded project that seeks to turbocharge advanced manufacturing capability in the region

Mr O'Dowd said the construction of both schools would provide a

major economic boost to the region with hundreds of jobs to be created during the construction of both projects.

"Construction of the CQUniversity Schools of Mining and Advanced Manufacturing will create an estimated 311 local jobs in Central Queensland, including 114 in Gladstone, and inject millions of dollars into the local economy," Mr O'Dowd said.

"Manufacturing supports thousands of jobs in the region and in the longer term, this new facility in Gladstone will further support Queenslanders to get an education that leads to a career in the manufacturing industry.

"This is a major win for Gladstone, Rockhampton and the broader Central Queensland region, with both Schools to deliver world class facilities, resources, and technology to support the education of the workforces of tomorrow."

# keto diet

#### IT SEEMS LIKE EVERYONE IS TALKING ABOUT THE KETOGENIC (KETO) DIET.

With many people boasting it's benefits, it can sound like an exciting train to jump on. Before beginning a new diet plan, however, it's always a good idea to weigh up the pros and cons.

The keto diet requires a rigorous limitation of carbohydrates while allowing a liberal ingestion of fats (including saturated fats).

So what are the pros? The keto diet induces a rapid weight loss. It is not entirely clear, however, if the loss is due to water loss, a special effect of the diet itself (i.e. fat burning) or a reduction in total calorie intake. The keto diet helps reduce seizures in pediatric patients with epilepsy.

The keto diet can have a direct impact on glucose concentrations, lowering them over time and improving insulin sensitivity for patients with diabetes.

There are, however, a number of cons that may outway the potential benefits. Being so restrictive keto diet adopters may experience nutrient deficiencies as they are not receiving the nutrients - vitamins, minerals, fibres - from fruits, legumes, vegetables and whole grains.

This can lead to increased constipation. During the diet transition, many people experience uncomfortable side effects such as hunger, headaches, nausea, fatigue, irritability and brain fog that may last days. This is referred to as 'Keto Flu'.

The increased consumption of fats, specifically saturated fats on the keto diet, can increase cardiovascular disease risk.

Patients with kidney disease have an increased risk of requiring dialysis on the keto diet due to the additional ketones that their renal system has to process.

With so much fat to metabolize, the diet may make any existing liver conditions worse.

The keto diet may harm bone health in the long term, increasing bone breakdown and a reduction of bone formation (osteoporosis).

Many people have trouble sticking with such a restrictive diet. For others, its rigid nature can lead to obsessive and disordered eating.

### AVOCADO, PROSCIUTTO & PECAN SALAD

A super-easy and intricate side salad packed with luxurious flavour and texture. If you're planning to transport this dish for a bring-a-plate meal, check out our notes for pack and travel tips.

#### **Ingredients:**

8 slices prosciutto, thin 3 avocados 1 tablespoon lime rind, finely grated 1/3 cup lime juice 1/4 cup extra virgin olive oil 1 cup fresh coriander leaves 1 cup fresh flat-leaf parsley leaves 2/3 cup pecans, toasted, roughly chopped 2 long red chillies, seeded, finely chopped

#### Method:

Heat a large frying pan over high heat. Add prosciutto. Cook for 2 minutes each side or until golden and crisp. Drain on paper towel. Break up into pieces. Peel and quarter avocados. Place in a bowl. Add lime rind, juice and oil.

Season with salt and pepper. Toss gently to coat.

Arrange avocado in a serving bowl. Sprinkle with prosciutto, coriander, parsley, pecans and chilli. Serve.

## A PASSENGER TRAIN ARRIVING ON AUCKLAND POINT WHARF

#### TO CONVEY THE MAIL TRAIN WAGONS TO THE SHIP'S SIDE, A TURNTABLE WAS CONSTRUCTED IN 1899 AND A RAIL LINK TO THE JETTY WAS BUILT.

Mail vans were placed in front of the passenger train at the railway station and when the train approached the wharf the mail vans were individually placed on the turntable. From there, waterside workers pushed the vans onto the wharf proper and loaded them onto the ship, while return vans had already been unloaded from the vessel. Likewise, the passengers would alight from the train and continue their journey by ship, or they would disembark from the ship and continue their journey by train.

The timetables of the trains and the vessel usually required the southern train travellers to cool their heels around Gladstone for some twenty-four hours before the ship was again ready to travel. The mail service continued no matter

how rough the seas became and, although this caused delays, it always got through. Many fine ships were employed on the service and no vessel was better than the Bingara, which was small graceful and dependable. In 1909 the approach was extended so that the mail and passengers would continue completely onto the wharf proper.

This famous service became known to thousands of people throughout Australia and continued for twenty-six years. It was not until the line was built to Mackay that the service became redundant in February 1924.
